BOATS, WHARFS & MARINAS in April


The world of boats, wharfs & marinas can be quite diverse but they have one common factor - water transportation. Whether transporting cargo, people and animals, or racing for a win, it is on the water. How the water reflects and moves adds great effect to your artworks. The type of sky just as important for the subject. Think carefully about the horizon, sky colour and how the clouds might direct the eye. Remember "Value" is about 'Light' or 'Lack of Light' of which this topic has bucketloads. If you can capture the movement, even better.

- · How does the time of day or weather impact my composition?
- Which colour scheme best portrays my subject the way I wish? Triad? Tetradic square or rectangle? Analogous side by side?
- How will I use each colour to attract and direct the viewer through my artwork? The amount? The position?
- Think about colour combinations that will be impactful to set the mood without detracting from the main subject.
- Do you need to show every aspect of the scene or subject?
- · How much detail do you need? Sometimes less is better?



"SHARED GROUND" Community Exhibition in MAY



The month of May contains National Reconciliation Week which creates an opportunity for our Community Connections Event for 2024. The "Shared Ground" Exhibition fits well with the topic of reconciliation. Indigenous and non-indigenous artists producing artworks that delve into the topic of shared ground with each other or with the earth. These works can be about wants or wishes, social comment or a sharing of art styles or ideas/knowledge. Twenty-five First Nations artists plus twenty-five HBAS member artists get to contribute two works each.

1. **Make your artwork speak to the viewer.** What is the message or meaning relating to the topic you wish viewers of your artwork to gain? How can you use shape, colour, position to lead the viewer's eye? Which colour scheme will suit your topic and create the impact you are looking for?



3. **MEDIUM or MATERIAL choice** can add significantly to making your artwork have impact or be unique. Be open to trying textures or using unusual materials or applying a medium in a different way. Cross-pollinate between the two cultures - be inventive - see what you can create.

2.**Good Composition** is key to getting and keeping the viewer's attention. Whether it is the rule of thirds, the golden spiral or one of the simple shape or letter composition guides. Each technique is effective in its own way by


